#### **Thought #1**

“I don’t know if it’s such a good idea that my husband let our 6-year-old son play his computer games, even if they are about history.”

#### **Philippians 4:8 Truth**

“My husband is spending quality time with our son and that is AMAZING in itself. My son is getting close to his dad and learning a ton about history at the same time and when he gets older he probably won’t have time for the typical-teenage stuff because he is so into what his dad did with him as a kid. PLUS, I’d much rather my son learn management of his time while he is living at home where we can influence him and control his environment.”

#### **Thought #2**

“My husband is always gone and when he is home, he doesn’t have as much time for me as I’d like. He has time for the things he wants to do.”

#### **Philippians 4:8 Truth**

#### **Thought #3**
